There is the story of a pastor who got up one Sunday and announced to the congregation: 'I have good news and bad news. The good news is, we have enough money to pay for our new building program. The bad news is, it's still out there in your pockets.'

As United Methodists, we pledge to support our church with our prayers, our presence, our gifts, and our service. Each of these is equally important to the life of the church, and each one is like a coin we hold in our pockets. As we celebrate our Harvest Festival this year, I urge you to consider the "coins" you "hold" in your "pockets."

*Prayers – One of the most powerful things we can do for any situation, person, or institution is to pray. When we support our church with our prayers, we ask God to reveal to us His will for our congregation, and the ways that we as a congregation are best suited to accomplish His will for us. A regular, active prayer life engaged in by the people of a congregation will produce unbelievable blessings for a church!

*Presence – Our time is one of the most valuable assets we have. In today's hectic world, it seems as though there isn't enough time in a day, a week, a month, or a year. Sometimes, I have to remind myself to take time to breathe—do you? Giving your time to be present in worship on Sunday, or in Sunday school, or helping with an event at church, or supporting an event with your attendance, is a great gift that only you can give.

*Gifts—As diverse members of the body of Christ, God has given us each different gifts, with the intent that we will come together as one body and use our varied gifts to accomplish God's work in the world. All gifts are given by God, and all gifts are used by God when we

are willing servants. When we use our gifts for the sake of the church, we join together with our sisters and brothers to complement each other's talents in order that, as a complete body, we praise God by using what he has given us for the benefit of others.

*Service—A congregation can only accomplish its mission in the world if its people are willing to serve. Jesus himself gave us the most true and complete picture of what service looks like—service to God and service to other people. By following Jesus' example of servant leadership, we can be to our congregation, to our community, and to the world, the hands and feet of Christ. There isn't any greater honor we can receive, than to someday hear God's words spoken to us, "Well done, my good and faithful servant."

Each one of us has been given a slightly different "currency," but all are meant to be taken out of our pockets and placed into the "offering plate" of opportunity that God places before us.
