As you probably know, my family and I recently returned from a vacation at the beach. They spent hours playing and learning and laughing, and we could hardly get them to leave when it was time to go.

Like this strange and wonderful day on the beach, life circumstances outside our control sometimes cause us to wonder what is in store for us. It seems as though our whole world changes overnight—and the change is not looking so good. We ask ourselves if it is worthwhile to even participate in life, if that's the way it's w going to be.

And yet, our God has assured us that He is in charge: "For surely I know the y plans I have for you, says the LORD, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give ↓ you a future with hope." 
COME GROW WITH US!

We're excited about starting up again with our Fall activities and about everyone getting back together again.


